In school grown ups help us to keep safe. These include teachers, teaching assistants, volunteers and lunchtime supervisors. Here are a few ways in which they keep us safe.

Grown ups make our school a safe place to learn for example they lock the gates, keep us safe on the school playground.

Assemblies take place in school about keeping safe. Visitors such as the NSPCC come to talk to pupils about safeguarding.

Information is displayed on health and safety noticeboards around the school.

All our staff are trained to make sure all pupils feel safe. Adults can talk to any grown ups in our school

At playtimes and lunchtimes we have special rules to follow. If we are worried we can see a grown up or a buddy who will help solve our problems.



We learn how to keep safe through our Jigsaw curriculum.

We have school rules that are there to keep us safe this includes on the computer.

Safe recruitment and selection of staff

Our school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. All posts are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act, therefore all convictions must be declared. Providing false information is an offence. Appointed staff, governors, regular volunteers and trainees have identity, qualification and disclosure and barring checks and have been successfully cleared to work with children.

Through our day-to-day contact with pupils and direct work with families, staff have a crucial role to play in noticing indicators of possible abuse or neglect.
